UNC Greensboro is located on more than 250 acres, less than a mile from the city's downtown center. Construction is currently underway on a \$105 million building to house our School of Nursing as well as teaching and research labs for the School of Health and Human Sciences and the Departments of Biology and Chemistry.

LIVE LIKE A SPARTAN

There are more than 25 residence halls available for UNC Greensboro students, ranging from traditional halls built in 1904 to apartment-style buildings opened in 2018.

About 80% of our first year students opt to live on campus where they can choose from 11 traditional-style residences. Check the flow chart below to see where you might find your home at UNCG.

DINING HOT SPOTS

When it comes to food, you've got options. Spartan Dining is Ranked #1 in NC Public Universities by NICHE. There are 25 places to eat on campus, plus many more nearby.

- Fountain View Dining Our full service cafeteria is big on variety. There are 15 food stations, including a station that avoids the 8-major food allergens.
- Elliott University Center Grab a sandwich from The Marketplace, get yourChick-Fil-A fix or stop by the food court to enjoy Mexican food from Salsarita's as well as wraps, salads, pizza, and burgers from our other locations.
- The Shops at Spartan Village This new marketplace has a full grocery store, plus dining locations like Pita Delite, Tropical Smoothie Café, Taco Bao, and The Den (part of the Denny's chain).
- Additional Campus Locations We can't miss Bojangles' Famous Fried Chicken and TacoBell, Pizza Hut, and Wingstreet.

Grab a bite, or several, at Fountain View Dining, where you can get your fill from food stations including salad bar, deli, flat top grill, and choose-your-own stir fry.

How It Works: Choosing a Meal Plan

Student dining memberships give you a set number of meals in Fountain View Dining, plus additional "flex" dollars valid at other campus dining locations. Freshmen living on campus must have a meal plan.

- 1. Spartan Unlimited = Unlimited meals at Fountain View, 5 guest swipes, plus \$100 in Flex per semester.
- 2. Spiro's 15 = 15 meals per week, plus \$250 in Flex per semester.
- 3. Charlie's 10 = 10 meals per week, plus \$400 in Flex per semester.
- 4. The Gold Pack = 117 meals per semester (average 7 a week), plus \$600 in Flex.
- 5. The Blue Pack = 65 meals per semester (average 4 a week), plus \$850 in Flex.
- 6. Rawkin Pack = 27 meals per semester (average 2 per week), plus \$200 in Flex.
- 7. The Sweet 16 = 16 meals per semester, plus \$175 in Flex.

Flex only meal plans are also available for upperclassmen during the semester in increments of \$1,050, \$750, \$450, and \$150.

THIS IS A CAMPUS THAT CARES.

Students First Office

One of the most popular safety measures for our students is the LiveSafe App. This free app allows you to request a SafeWalk escort, view emergency alerts, access campus safety maps, and file anonymous police reports.

On campus

Catch the Spartans in Action – UNC Greensboro has 17 NCAA Division I sports teams so there's almost always a game going on. Most games are free or offer low cost tickets. **uncgspartans.com**

Watch a Future Star – The College of Visual and Performing Arts offers 350+ annual performances, exhibits, lectures, and masterclasses each year. See our music, theatre, or dance ensembles in action. <u>vpa.uncg.edu</u>

Get your Art Fix –The Weatherspoon Art Museum has one of the largest collections of modern American art in the Southeast, and it's located right here on campus. Admission is free. <u>weatherspoon.uncg.edu</u>

Get a Taste of Campus Life – Grab a plate and try the all-you-can-eat selection at Fountain View Dining. Single meal prices range from \$7-10. <u>dineoncampus.com/uncg</u>

Seasonal Campus Traditions

International Fest (April) – Come out for free activities, performances, and food from cultural groups representing UNCG and Greensboro's international community.

Science Everywhere (April) – University students and faculty share the wonders of science with local families through hands-on activities in labs across campus.

Homecoming (October) – A full week of festivities include the Homecoming soccer game, lip synch contest, bonfire, concert, and festival.

Vacc Bell Tower Lighting and Luminary Walk (November/December) – A kick off to the holiday season with festive songs played on the carillon bells. Later in the month, campus pathways are lined with luminaries.

In the city

Tate Street – Day and night, students flock to the restaurants and shops that line the eastern edge of campus. From coffee shops (there are three!) to a late night bakery, you've got lots of options.

LeBauer Park – This downtown greenspace is central to many community events and activities. Grab a bite to eat at the on-site cafes and admire the eye-catching aerial sculpture. Catch movies on the lawn Friday evenings throughout the summer. <u>www.greensborodowntownparks.org</u>

Guilford Courthouse National Military Park – This site commemorates the Battle of Guilford Courthouse, fought in 1781, which marked a turning point in America's road to victory in the Revolutionary War. Re-enactments are staged here each March. <u>www.nps.gov/guco</u>

International Civil Rights Museum – Located in the iconic Woolworth Building where America's sit-in movement began. This museum is devoted to the international struggle for civil and human rights. <u>www.sitinmovement.org</u>

Professional Sports – Sports lovers rejoice! Greensboro has several local teams, including the Greensboro Grasshoppers (minor league baseball), Greensboro Swarm (NBA G League), and Carolina Cobras (arena football). The city also hosts the PGA Tour's Wyndham Championship every summer.

UNCG's priority FAFSA deadline is December 1, and first-time student aid is awarded in mid-March. If you're applying to a term other than Fall, check with Financial Aid to see if you should submit a FAFSA for additional aid years.
